# WHAT IS POSITIVE + NEGATIVE SPACE?













Notan (a Japanese word meaning dark-light) focuses on the interaction between positive and negative space, a relationship embodied in the ancient symbolism of the Yang and the Yin. In composition, it recognizes the separate but equally important identity of both a shape and its background.














How do Japanese create notan art?
Originally notan works were created with ink and paper. Ink would be diluted to create darker or lighter brushstrokes, while the white paper provided the light backdrop: the negative space. Using this method and carefully considering the balance of their compositions, Japanese artists create notan art.











































### **Art is about Learning to SEE!**

Notan/Zentangle Lesson

### **Learning Target**

Create artwork using the elements of art and principles of design.

Students will use lines, shapes and patterns, to create balanced compositions.

- 1. Create a Notan design using geometric and/or organic shapes.
- 2. Practice making pattern designs to incorporate into your final artwork.
- 3. Choose an animal, person, object, or use a template to create an outline for your final compositions.
- 4. Create two final compositions in black and white that include pattern in the design.

### Art Lesson Objectives:

### Objective 1: (connects to Re: Responding) NVAS 7.2

Perceive and analyze artistic work.

Students will view artworks and engage in a class discussion about how positive and negative space is used to achieve balance in a composition.

### Objective 2: (connects to Cr: Creating) NVAS 1.2

Generate and conceptualize artistic ideas and work.

Students will create a black and white collage based on the idea of Notan art.

### Objective 3: (connects to Cr: Creating) NVAS 2.1

Organize and develop artistic ideas and work.

Students will create two black and white compositions using both representational and abstract design.

**Time Frame:** Three to four 45-minute class periods

### **Day 1**: Slide Show Presentation (10min)

Students will create a simple Notan (30min.)

Cleanup (5 min.)

### **Day 2**: Slide Show Presentation/ View Examples (10min)

Students will work on pattern worksheet. (10min.)

Students will work on first part of Notan/Zentangle (20 min)

Cleanup (5 min.)

### Day 3: Review (5 min)

Students will work on second part of Notan/Zentangle (40 min)

Cleanup (5 min.)

### Day 4: Review (5 min)

Students will work on finishing their artwork (35 min.)

Cleanup (3 min.)

### **Art Vocabulary and Definitions:**

**Space**-The element of art that describes the area around, within, or between images or elements in any work.

**Positive Space**- is the space inside the area of an object or shape.

Negative Space-The area around an object or form.

<u>Contrast</u>- Positive and Negative space can help to make contrast. In art Contrast is the arrangement of light + dark, large + small shapes and rough + smooth textures)

**Composition**-The arrangements of the elements of art in a work of art.

<u>Balance</u>-A principle of design concerned with the arrangement of one or more elements in a work of art to create a sense of stability; the three types of balance are symmetrical, asymmetrical, and radial.

**Symmetry**-The quality of an image nearly or identically matching on both sides.

<u>Asymmetry</u>-(informal balance) The right and left sides are not the same, but still balance each other.

<u>Notan</u>-(a Japanese word meaning dark-light) focuses on the interaction between positive and negative space, a relationship embodied in the ancient symbolism of the Yang and the Yin.

**Zentangle**-an abstract drawing created using repetitive patterns.

# STEP by STEP NOTAN/ZENTANGLE

### Part 1 Composition #1

- Step 1: Choose a template of an animal or person, or create your own.
- Step 2: Using the template, draw an outline with pencil on 8.5x11" white paper.
- **Step 3**: Break up the inner part of your outline by drawing lines and creating sections that you will be drawing different patterns in.
- **Step 4**: Draw different patterns in each section. Use the pattern sheet for ideas, or make up your own.
- Step 5: Trace over your drawing with sharpie and erase all the pencil lines.
- **Step 6**: Cut out your drawing and glue it on to your 9x12" black construction paper.

### Part 2 Composition #2

- **Step 1**: Use the same template from your part 1 outline drawing. Draw the outline on to the 9x12'' white construction paper. Make sure to flip/mirror your image.
- **Step 2**: Color in the outline completely in black. (Another option is to do the outline on black paper and cut it out and then glue it down on to your 9x12" white construction paper.)
- **Step 3**: Break up the space surrounding your drawing into sections.
- **Step 4**: Create different patterns in each section. Refer to the first part of this project you created, and use similar designs.

Remember to be mindful of where you place your outline drawings on both compositions. Positive and negative space can form an important part of your overall composition. You can use positive and negative space to create a sense of balance and rhythm. Balance is one of the basic principles of design and refers to how well all the elements are balanced with each other.



### CREATE A NOTAN DESIGN


Nōtan (濃淡) is a Japanese design concept involving the play and placement of light and dark elements as they are placed next to the other in the composition of art and imagery.

### Step 1

Draw shapes on your black square making sure that you start and end your line on the same edge of the paper square. You can draw either geometric or organic shapes.




**Step 3**Flip each shape so that it mirrors the cut-out part.



Step 2

Cut your shapes out carefully because you will be using all the pieces.



Step 4

Glue down the main central square on to the center of your white paper. Then glue down your shapes making sure each piece is aligned perfectly to the edge of the square.
